

DEMOGRAPHICS

San Joaquin County has a well-balanced, diversified economy with a wide range of employment and housing opportunities.

It is projected that San Joaquin County's annual population growth will average 1.7 percent between 2010 and 2015, well above the projected state and national growth rates of 1.1 percent. The County is expected to reach the one million milestone by 2036. Expansion is projected in the retail, service, office and manufacturing sectors of the economy. It is the County's goal to provide a well-balanced, diversified economy with employment opportunities for all economic segments of the County. San Joaquin County is aggressively pro-business and is committed to growth while maintaining a desirable business and living environment as well as preserving natural resources.

LABOR FORCE

Employers in San Joaquin County benefit from a large, growing, and productive labor pool. With a work force of 299,200 in February of 2013, unemployment in San Joaquin County was 14.7% compared to 9.7% statewide. In addition, the CalWorks employment center is a valuable labor resource, with a monthly pool of approximately 400 ready-to-work employees. Much of the County's unemployment is due to seasonal variation in the agricultural sector and related food processing industries. The unemployed labor pool at the end of February 2013 totaled 43,900 persons.
